Meeting Details:

1. WELCOME

At 9:00 am, Gareth Harker, chair of the Classis Ministries Team, welcomed everyone present, and introduced William Koopmans, Pastor of Hope CRC.

2. OPENING WORSHIP

- 2.1. William Koopmans, pastor at Hope Christian Reformed Church, Brantford, led in devotions. He began by pronouncing the blessing based on Numbers 6:22-27 where the Lord instructed Moses to tell Aaron and his sons how they were to bless the Israelites. This instruction for blessing the people did not come at the end of their forty-year journey through the desert when they entered the promised land. Instead it came near the beginning of their wilderness journey. The delegates were encouraged to take comfort from this as we, too, are in the current wilderness of the COVIV-19 pandemic. We do not yet know where this pandemic will lead us and what the outcome will be, but the certainty of the Lord's blessing is with us.
- 2.2. At this point the delegates and visitors were divided into five breakout rooms where each group participating church was encouraged to share how the Lord had blessed them during the current pandemic.
- 2.3. Next Elder Mike Bekendam, chair of Hope CRC's council, shared a ministry update.
- 2.4. They currently have one morning worship service that is well attended both in person and via livestreaming.
- 2.5. They have discovered new opportunities for worship and ministry.
 - a. Sunday school continues via Zoom on Sunday afternoons.
 - b. Young People & Careers groups engage together with good programs.
 - c. GEMS and Cadets are continuing their ministries with both outdoor and home activities.
 - d. Catechism takes place via Zoom.
- 2.6. Council believes that the congregation remains unified and positive. Members model grace and unity.
- 2.7. Recently council held a five-hour Saturday meeting during which decisions were made for implementing various vision priorities, from new or expanded ministries and staffing to branding (with the adoption of a new Hope CRC logo) and facility improvements.
- 2.8. Vice-Chair, Joel Bootsma then prayed for Hope CRC and the deliberations of the classis meeting.
- 3. CALL TO ORDER
 - 3.1. Chair of Classis, Benjamin Ponsen, called the meeting to order, welcomed all delegates and guests, and offered some brief comments regarding the process for the day, especially in light of the electronic limitations that might be experienced. He encouraged all delegates to participate as much as possible by clearly indicating when they wished to speak. Since local church delegates were gathered at the same place locally, he asked the delegate sitting in front of the computer camara to clearly indicate by raising fingers how many of the delegates voted in favour of each motion as it came up.
 - 3.2. On behalf of the stated clerk, he asked each local church delegation to confirm by telephone text or email to state the names of all delegates present. All churches were represented by delegates as shown on the previous page.

- 3.3. The Chair drew attention to the Covenant for Office Bearers that was printed in the Agenda and asked all delegates to indicate their continued commitment to the Covenant by raising their hands.
- 3.4. After this the Chair of Classis RULED THAT: Classis Hamilton was properly constituted.
- 3.5. The Chair then **RULED THAT**: the Agenda and the Addendum as communicated to the churches and delegates are approved for discussion and action where appropriate.
- 4. CLASSIS MINISTRIES TEAM REPORT
 - 4.1. Gareth Harker, Chair of the CMT, gave a brief verbal report of CMT's activities.
 - 4.2. He then presented the name of Bruce Adema to serve as the next Chair of Classis.On Motion duly made, seconded and carried IT WAS RESOLVED THAT: Bruce Adema is elected as the Chair of Classis for the period November 1, 2020 until May 31, 2021.
 - 4.3. He then recommended that John Demik be elected as a first term member of the CMT. On Motion duly made, seconded and carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT:** John Demik is elected as a member of the CMT for a first term.
 - 4.4. He then recommended that Willemina Zwart and Shae-Lynn Knevel be re-elected for a first and second term respectively.
 - On Motion duly made, seconded and carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT:** Willemina Zwart is elected for a first term and Shae-Lynn Knevel is elected for a second term on the Campus Ministry Committee.
 - 4.5. He then drew attention to the fact that an additional nominee had been presented by the Campus Ministry committee to fill the vacancy left by Brian Van Oosten, the former Mohawk College faculty representative on the committee. Wayne Visser has been found willing to take Brian's place and although that information was not included in the agenda or addendum, he recommended that the delegates approve Wayne's appointment.

On Motion duly made, seconded and carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT:** Wayne Visser is elected to serve a first term on the Campus Ministry Committee.

4.6. He then recommended that Jackie Bootsma be elected as a member of the Classis Hamilton Home Missions Committee as nominated by that committee.

On Motion duly made, seconded and carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT:** Jackie Bootsma is elected as a member of the Home Missions Committee for a first term.

4.7. He then drew attention to the external reports in the Agenda.

On Motion duly made, seconded and carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT:** the written reports from Canadian Ministries, World Renew, Calvin Theological Seminary, Redeemer University College, Resonate Global Mission and Diaconal Ministries Canada are received for information.

- 4.8. Approval of CMT's Work:
 - The Chair of Classis **RULED THAT:** the work of the CMT to date as reported to the churches in the CMT minutes and the classis Agenda is approved.
- 5. CLASSIS INTERIM COMMITTEE REPORT
 - 5.1. Gillian Bruce, President of the CIC, highlighted a few items from the CIC and Stated Clerk's Report where the CIC had taken final decisions in May due to COVID-19 which normally would have been taken by classis had it been able to meet at that time. She then drew attention to the recommendation in the Agenda to adopt the procedure to be followed during the appeal in an executive session.
 - 5.2. On Motion duly made, seconded and carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT:** Classis adopts the following procedure to be followed in appeals under Church Order, Article 30-a:

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- 1. Each party will make an opening statement summarizing the issues as they understand them which must be limited to the specific issue under appeal.
- 2. The appellant, or his/her representative, will make a more detailed presentation including stating the policy authorities to which the appeal is made. In the process of outlining the case, the appellant may call witnesses with direct knowledge of the issues.
- 3. The respondent will proceed in the same way as the appellant with the same right to call witnesses.
- 4. If either party asks witnesses to speak, the other party will have the right to ask them questions. The delegates also have the right to ask questions of witnesses, but only as to fact or for clarification.
- 5. The appellant and respondent will have the right to summarize their cases and participate in the preliminary deliberation dealing with facts and further clarification.
- 6. The Chair of Classis, or a person designated by the Chair, then enters into prayer for the deliberations.
- 7. Both the appellant and respondent will then recuse themselves.
- 8. The delegates then enter into their own deliberation and vote by ballot whether they sustain the appeal or not.
- 9. The Chair of Classis then invites the parties back into the meeting and announces the decision.
- 10. Unless there are other subsidiary issues to be addressed, the session will be closed with prayer for all concerned
- 5.3. She then introduced the individuals presented by the CIC to be nominees for election as directors at the AGM later that morning.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT**: William Koopmans, Ken Tigchelaar, Ida Kaastra-Mutoiga, Gillian Bruce and Ben Ponsen as a single slate of nominees to serve as directors of the corporation to be elected during the annual general meeting of members is approved.

5.4. She then shared information about the need for new church visitors and recommended the extension Ralph Koops to serve a second term and Michael Bootsma to serve a first term as church visitors.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT**: Ralph Koops is elected as a church visitor for a second term and Michael Bootsma is elected as a church visitor for a first term.

5.5. Gillian then presented the recommendation to extend the licence to exhort for Al Wolters for an additional term

On motion duly made, seconded and carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT**: the license to exhort of Al Wolters is extended for another three years. GROUNDS:

- a. Al Wolters currently is the only licensed exhorter in Classis Hamilton.
- b. There is a need as evidenced by the fact that AI has been preaching an average of a dozen times during each of the previous three years.
- c. The request has been supported by his home church.
- 5.6. She then presented the budget for the 2021 year. A few questions were asked and answered.
- 5.7. After the budget discussion the Chair of Classis appealed to the delegates that their local churches were making a covenantal commitment to send the approved classical ministry share amount to classis once the motion has been approved.
 - 5.7.1.On motion duly made, seconded and carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT**: the budget for 2021 and the classical per active member ministry shares in the amount of \$81.51 is approved.

- 5.8. She then presented the recommendation to hold a special in-person executive session of classis to hear an appeal on December 8, 2020. She expressed some uncertainty as to whether an in-person meeting will still be permitted on that date.
 - On motion duly made, seconded and carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT**: a special in-person executive meeting be held on December 8, 2020 at Hope CRC, Brantford, at 7:30 PM provided that the health department of Brant County will still permit such in-person meetings on that date.
- 5.9. She then requested that classis approve the work of the CIC and Stated Clerk. On motion duly made, seconded and carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT**: the work of the CIC and the Stated Clerk as reported in its minutes and the Agenda is approved.
- 6. THE CHAIR OF CLASSIS DECLARED A 20 MINUTE BREAK
- 7. CHURCH VISITORS' SUMMARY REPORT
 - 7.1. Peter Bulthuis addressed a few matters raised in the summary report and noted that a number of the items had already been dealt with by the CIC. A few questions were raised. He asked Immanuel CRC, Hamilton to elaborate on their "intriguing model of pastoral visiting" which they did. Churches were encouraged to contact Immanuel directly if they wanted to know more about their model. Lesli van Milligan was asked to address a question by Ebenezer CRC, Jarvis regarding the availability of excellent catechism materials.
 - 7.2. The Chair of Classis thanked the church visitors for their work and stated that its is much appreciated by his church and others who receive such visits of encouragement. The Chair of Classis **RULED THAT**: the Summary Report from the church visitors is received as information.
- 8. ADJOURNMENT TO HOLD THE AGM
- 9. RETURN FROM AGM AND STAFF REPORTS
 - 9.1. The reports of Michael Fallon, chaplain at McMaster and John Bijl, Youth Ministries Champion were dealt with next. Michael had presented a written report in the Agenda but John was not able to do so. The chair of the Youth Ministries Team shared why John did not present a written report.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT**: the staff reports were received as information.

10. CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE REPORT

- 10.1. The Credential Committee reported that no matters had been raised on the credentials that required their attention.
- 10.2. The Chair of Classis thanked them for their work.
- **11. REIMAGINING MINISTRY SHARES**
 - 11.1. Peter Elgersma shared that much information has already been shared and there is no need to repeat all of it. He would summarize it as follows:
 - a. We are moving from a "suggested amount" that we request to a "please let us know what we can expect" system.
 - b. The current (fall) meeting is the time that we are asking churches to submit their pledge.

- c. We are asking Clerks to assemble those pledges and share them back with the denomination.
- d. The final number is due before January 31st.
- e. In February, the denomination begins our budget planning and we will now know that financial side that we will be working within.
- f. I acknowledge that a pledge for the period of July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022 spans multiple fiscal years for most churches. This generally goes much further than most churches are used to budgeting for. But that is the reason we are simply asking for a pledge.
- 11.2. Peter stated that a separate communication will be coming about the short (6 month period) of Jan 2021 June 2021
- 11.3. He also asked that classis consider a follow-up conversation at its February meeting regarding the overall Denominational Ministry Share commitments made by the churches and how those compare with the prior year when a specific per active member contribution was requested. This request was referred to the CIC for consideration.

12. DENOMINATIONAL RESTRUCTURING

- 12.1. Darren Roorda briefly reviewed the legal restructuring that had been necessitated as a result of legal opinions regarding compliance with Canadian law. He pointed out that the legal requirement for the Canadian Corporation of the CRCNA (Can Corp) to have "direction and control" over all its resources would of necessity affect the ministries undertaken in Canada and worldwide.
- 12.2. Chris Bosch then outlined the possibilities for Can Corp to demonstrate direction and control while at the same time remaining part of the bi-national denomination. He also pointed out that this restructuring gives the Can Corp the opportunity to evaluate how they should relate to the black and indigenous communities in Canada. They hope to obtain more feedback from churches and delegates who have attended the meetings of all Canadian classes so that a report can be presented to Can Corp at its February 2021 meeting. Once completed, a final report will be presented to Synod 2021.
- 12.3. An observation was made by one of the delegates that the proposed kind of restructuring had been attempted by other formerly bi-national denominations with the ultimate outcome that two separate denominations were established. That raised the question as to why the option to have two separate, but cooperating denominations model was not on the table. The response was that this observation had been raised in other classes, but that it was rejected by the Council of Delegates in both nations because it was considered too radical. The majority of church members in both Canada and the USA desire to retain the bi-national denominational structure at this time.

13. MISCELANEOUS

- 13.1. Since the matters on the Agenda had been dealt with in a timely manner, the Chair of Classis asked whether there was anything else the delegates or guests would like to bring up for the good of all the churches.
- 13.2. Marian Lensink reminded the delegates that monthly online prayer meetings via Zoom were taking place sponsored by the Classis Hamilton Home Missions Committee to pray. The purpose is to pray not only for the work and church planting hopes of the committee, but also for the needs and of the local churches and other classical ministries.
- 13.3. William Koopmans asked for prayers for ecumenical relations.

- 13.4. Anthony Elenbaas reminded everyone that the Classis Hamilton Campus Ministry Committee is advertising for a chaplain to serve Mohawk College. The application deadline is November 6th. He asked all delegates to encourage any potential candidate in their churches to apply before the deadline.
- 13.5. Everett Vander Horst thanked the CIC for arranging the classis meeting in the Zoom format but asked that it consider a consent agenda so that agenda items dealing with simple administrative matters can be disposed of in one single motion. The CIC will take this request into consideration.

14. CLOSING

At 11:55 AM, the Chair of Classis thanked everyone for their work and participation during the day. He gave special thanks for the way Eric De Vries had managed the technical administrative matters for the meeting. He pointed out that this was the last meeting he would chair since Bruce Adema takes on the position of Chair of Classis on November 1st. He then asked Joel Bootsma to offer thanks to God for the meeting of the day as a whole.

15. NEXT MEETING

The next regular meeting of Classes Hamilton is to convene on Tuesday, February 23, 2021 at a venue and time to be announced later. Agenda deadline is January 12, 2021.
